(Optional)	Tips & Suggestions for Teachers
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tell students something like "remember we saw a special group of letters call huroof-e-halaqi or throat letters ح، غ، خ، ع، ه، ء، now we will learn the rule about them. - remind them: any alif with a symbol on it is a 'hamza'; only blank alifs are true true alifs - Reciting with "ikhfaa" is an advance rule. We will go over it but don't worry if you don't remember to do "ikhfaa" all the time...you can slowly make it a habit.
(Optional)	Ideas that may be offered to mothers to make it easier/fun to teach kids
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This rule is for recitation (qiraat) and not used in simple Arabic reading, so for younger children, can leave this till they know the difference between reading and recitation. - If teaching kids, can say 'noon' likes to play hide-and-seek چھپن چھپائی with all the letters so hides and becomes nasal. But it doesn't plays hide-and-seek with throat letters.
